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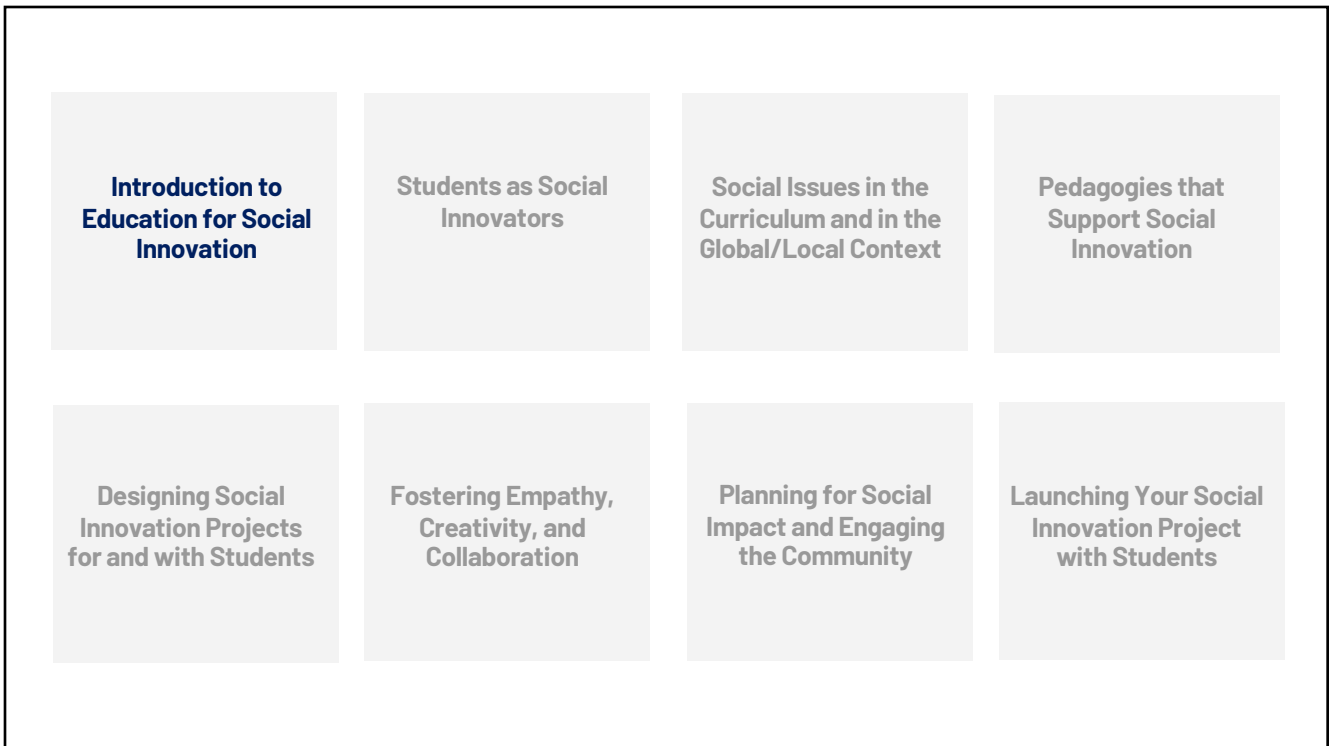
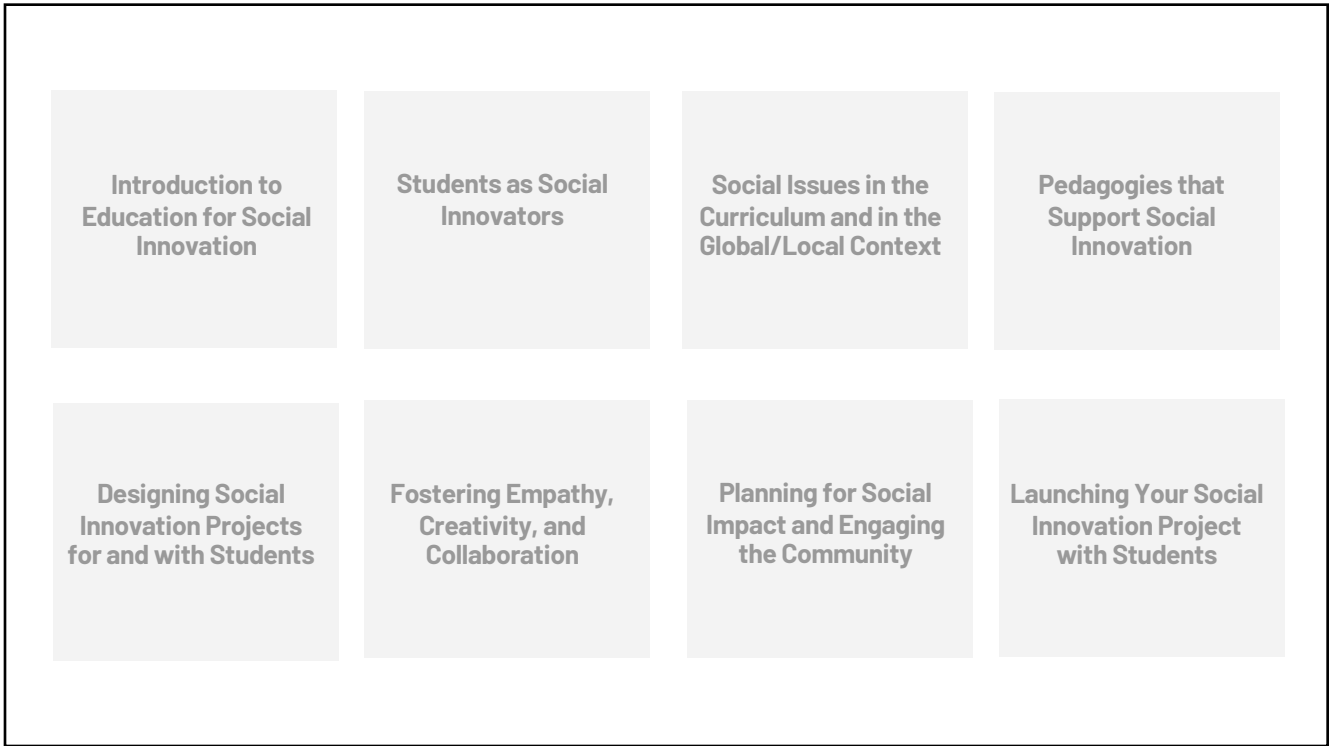

Social innovation . . .

“[produces] **viable solutions** to pressing **social and environmental problems**. There are many approaches to addressing societal concerns including **governmental policy** and **social activism**. Social Innovators engage these sectors but also utilize the **entrepreneurial practices** of the business sector to build solutions that are **self-sustaining and scalable** and are not dependent on charitable contributions or government funding.”

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Inquiry Learning

“Teacher framed, student led”
(quoted in *Deep Learning* by Michael Fullan)

- Essential/Driving Question
- Lines of Inquiry
- Student-Driven Questions



A Good Inquiry Question

- Invite multiple answers
- Be “un-Googleable”
- Be relevant to students
- Require an answer
- Be authentic and grounded in real-world issues
- Give students a real-world role
